The Five Kingdoms Chart

Kingdom	Where It Can Live	Cell Structure	How It Gets Nutrients (Food)	Examples
Monera	Some are found everywhere, including our bodies. Others are only in extreme conditions	<u>Single-celled</u> , no nucleus	Some can make their own food, others cannot	Eubacteria Archaeaebacteria
Protista	Live in moist environments and in water	Some are <u>single-celled</u> , others are <u>multi-celled</u> ; cells have a nucleus	Feed on other organisms	Amoebas, slime mold, and paramecium
Fungi	Live in moist environments	Most are <u>multi-celled</u>	Feed off dead organisms by absorbing nutrients	Mushrooms, yeast, molds, mildew
Plantae	Environments with water, sunlight, and carbon dioxide	Most are <u>multi-celled</u>	They are producers, also known as autotrophs, who make their own food through photosynthesis	Flowers, trees, mosses, ferns
Animalia	Found everywhere	<u>Multi-cellular</u> organisms	They are consumers, also known as heterotrophs, who eat other organisms	Fish, turtles, insects, worms, clams, humans
